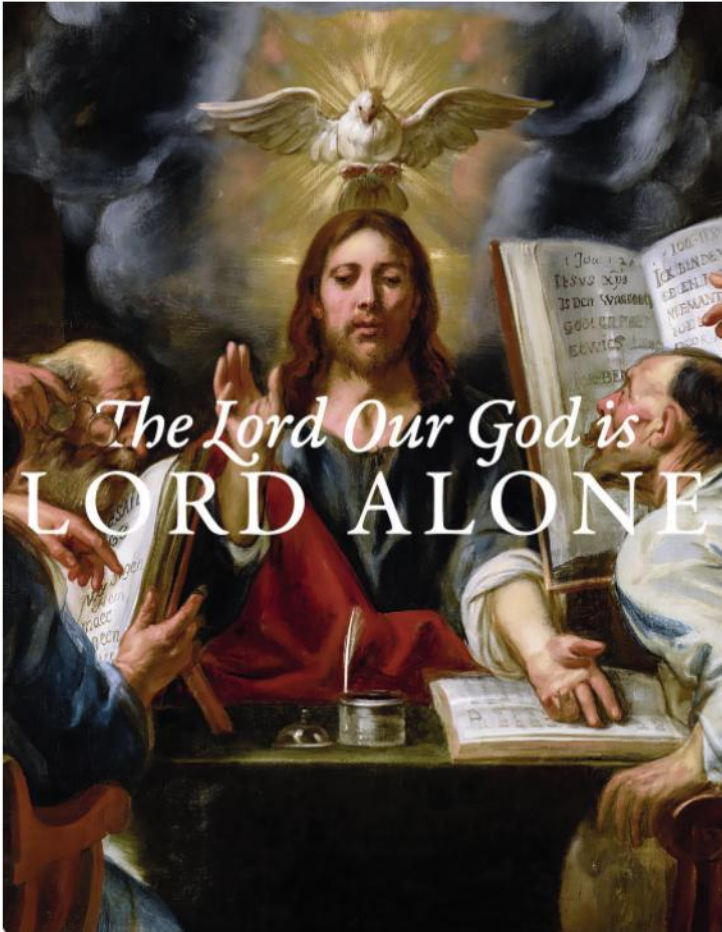

Parents of our young children, may we suggest...

- Relax! God put the wiggle in children; don't feel you must suppress it in God's house. All are welcome!
- Sit toward the front, where it is easier for your little ones to see and hear what's happening at the altar. They tire of seeing the backs of others' heads.
- Quietly explain the parts of the Mass and actions of the priest, altar servers, choir, etc.
- Sing the hymns, pray, and voice the responses. Children learn by copying you.
- If you have to leave Mass with your child, feel free to do so, but please come back. As Jesus said, "Let the children come to me."
- Remember that how we welcome children in church directly affects their responses to the church, to God, and to one another. Let them know that they are at home in this house of worship.

- The presence of children is a gift to the church, and they are a reminder that our parish is growing!

What is the OCIA Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens?

The Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens is for inquires in the OCIA process who are preparing for their Baptism. They are now ready to publicly declare their intention to continue their journey towards becoming Catholics. At this Rite, they are asked to more fully embrace the Gospel message with the help of God, and are also signed with the Cross to show that they now belong to Christ, the Shepherd of souls. In this Rite, the parish community has the opportunity to more fully participate in and pray for those in the OCIA process. At Sunday Mass, some of the inquirers who are considering joining the Catholic Church are going through the Rite of Acceptance. This Rite places these catechumens in a formal relationship with the universal Church. By Church law, the Pope and all bishops are to pray for those who have gone through this Rite. We encourage all parishioners to pray for these souls as well, as they continue in the initiation process over the coming months, and to reach out to them as fellow members of the Household of Christ.

What is the OCIA Rite of Welcoming?

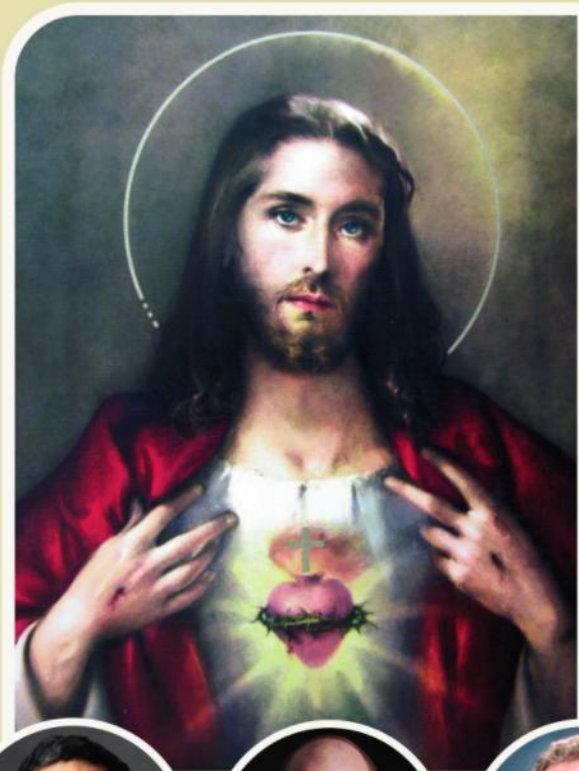
The Rite of Welcoming is for inquirers who have been previously baptized and are ready to publicly declare their intention to continue their journey toward full communion with the Catholic Church. At this Rite, they are asked if they are ready to listen to the apostles' instruction, gather with the worshipping community in prayer, and join that community in the love and service of others. They are signed with the Cross to show that they belong to Christ.

Why is the parish community important at the Rites of Acceptance and Welcoming?

Members of the parish community should affirm that they are ready to help and support the OCIA candidates seeking to follow Christ.

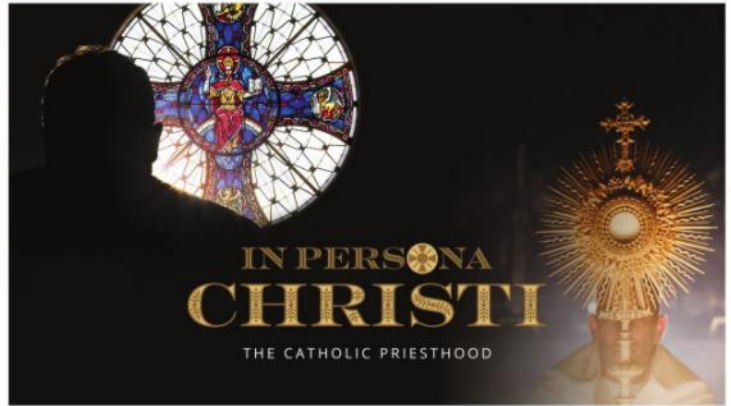

In Persona Christi: The Catholic Priesthood

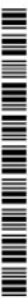

Vocations Awareness Week

During Vocations Awareness Week, we are called to reflect on and celebrate the ways God invites each of us to follow Him. Whether through the priesthood, religious life, or the sacrament of marriage, every vocation is a path to holiness and service. This week, we share the inspiring stories of individuals who have responded to God's call in these different vocations, offering their lives in love and dedication to Christ and the Church. We encourage everyone to prayerfully consider how God may be calling them.

Tips for discerning your vocation

1. Pray: A vocation is a call from God. In order to hear this call you must spend time talking to Him in prayer. Prayer is a conversation with God and like conversations with friends you have to take turns talking. Learning how to listen to God's voice can take time but comes with practice.
2. Frequent Confession and Mass: Going to Confession frequently helps keep you free from sin and gives grace to overcome your sinful tendencies. If we are immersed in sin, it will be very difficult to hear God's voice. Going to Mass more than just on Sundays can be a huge catalyst in growing closer to God and discerning your vocation. Receiving the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus in the Eucharist will strengthen you tremendously.
3. Talk to a priest: No matter what vocation you are discerning, talking with a priest can help you to see how God is working in your life and the ways in which He is calling you.
4. What are your deep desires: Discover the deep desires of your heart. God has given you these desires and wants to fulfill them in your vocation. These can often help lead you to your vocation.

Vocation Story: Father Michael Haemmerle

I grew up in a good Catholic family outside of Columbus near Lancaster. I am the oldest of five with a brother and three sisters. When I was young, I wanted to be an engineer just like my dad. When I was in 8th grade I had some time in adoration as part of a youth group type event. During this I took some time to just have a conversation with Jesus as I looked at Him in the Eucharist exposed on the Altar. I heard or sensed this small voice in my head saying "you could be a priest". I was surprised and wasn't sure what to think about it. I figured that if God was asking me to consider being a priest, I should probably give it a shot. I prayed about my vocation throughout high school and especially senior year. That senior year I didn't feel any pull or call to go to the seminary so I went to Ohio State and studied mechanical engineering. While I was at OSU, I began to hear God calling me to the priesthood again. I began to see more and more how the deep desires I had were met in the priesthood. That I was made to love and make sacrifices through the priesthood. After I graduated, I entered seminary and continued to see how awesome the priesthood is and how much I would love the life of a priest. To be able to celebrate the sacraments, to make Jesus Christ present in the Mass, to absolve sins in Confession, it's incredible. I get to be a part of every family. To be present at all the special moments of life, the hard and sad one and the joyful ones. I was just ordained on May 18th and have loved being a priest!



Vocation Story: Tabitha Kuckuck



The Catholic Church defines marriage as a lifelong covenant between a man and a woman that is ordered to the good of the couple and the procreation and education of children. A covenant is more than a contract, more than a piece of paper. It is a lifelong partnership between a man, a woman, and God. This is serious, and this is a magnificent gift from our Creator. Luke 9:23-24 states, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me." Marriage is an excellent path to put that call to action into practice.

My husband and I are converts, and we honestly had no idea the beauty, depth, sacrifice, and true blessing of which the vocation of marriage consisted when we were first married. Over years of realizing that marriage is not a fairytale, overcoming trials together, experiencing great joys, and having children, God has truly poured graces over us. He's taught us that two are better than one, even while we are still imperfect. He has given us one another to sharpen, as iron sharpens iron. He has given us children to instruct, which has strengthened our bond to one another, and to Him. We've been given the job to be the leaders in our domestic church, and that is as much of a blessing to us as it is to our children.

We have seen firsthand the bountiful graces the Lord lavishes over marriage time and time again in our eight short years (and counting). God gave us this gift so that we can draw closer to Him. He gave each of us a partner so we could learn to serve others before ourselves, to be forgiving and generous, to comfort in hard times, and celebrate in good. The vocation of marriage teaches us to be sacrificial, selfless, humble, patient, diligent, forgiving, and generous. All of these are virtues of Saints. As we work together and draw one another closer to Jesus, we are given the grace and mercy to progress closer to an eternity in heaven, and that sounds like a perfect plan to me.

Vocation Story: Sister Amor de Maria

I was born in Tennessee and grew up in Steubenville, Ohio. I was Protestant, but when I went to Franciscan University for my last year of college, I converted to the Catholic Faith. From the beginning of my conversion, I had a very strong devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary; I wanted to imitate her in every way. While at first I thought it would be in marriage, I discovered later that my desire to be a bride and mother could also be fulfilled in the Religious Life. I met the Sisters during a Rosary Procession and began volunteering with them. At the same time, I started Spiritual Direction with a priest. This helped me to understand what I was seeking and what God wanted of me. On a Lenten Retreat, Our Lady granted me a very special grace to understand that She was calling me to be her Daughter. I was afraid to enter the Religious Life because I knew it implied sacrificing many good things, but seeing the joy of the Sisters gave me hope that God could give me something even more beautiful than that which I would offer Him. After entering the Community, formation gave me a clear knowledge of our Charism. Being very sincere with myself and with the Mother, we continued the journey to discover the Will of God. I will never forget a phrase that the Mother said to me, "Sincerity is the key to perseverance." Receiving Jesus in the Eucharist and adoring Him every day, I can say has completely changed my life. Through prayer, I received a desire for God and to offer my life to Him. This reaffirmed me in my vocation. My devotion to Mary grew and grew and I know She helped me at every step. On August 28, 2021, I happily made my first vows in the Motherhouse in Spain. Now, I am back in the United States as a Daughter of Holy Mary of the Heart of Jesus, eager to spread the Love for God to the children at St. Paul!
